Limited Spaces Available for Smithsonian Journeys 2026 Solar Eclipse Programs in Spain

Travelers to View Total Solar Eclipse with Astronomers at Exclusive Events in Spain's Wine Country

Smithsonian Journeys, the Smithsonian's travel program and a leader in enriching small-group exploration, announced today that there is limited space available on its two popular 2026 Solar Eclipse programs in northern Spain. Travelers may choose from two expertly curated programs that feature renowned Spanish wine regions: one focused on Madrid and historic Old Castile and another featuring Basque Country and sites along the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage route.

"Solar eclipse travel is one of the fastest-growing segments in experiential travel," said Walter Littlejohn, senior vice president of Smithsonian Journeys. "These journeys offer travelers a rare chance to witness an extraordinary celestial event in a culturally rich part of the world—elevated by the insight, expertise, and thoughtful curation that define every Smithsonian Journeys experience."

This summer's solar eclipse sweeps down from the Arctic and across northern Spain. Smithsonian Journeys has created two distinct itineraries with private eclipse-watching events at wineries in the path of totality. Each program highlights the region's unique culinary traditions and explores art, history, and local culture through the lens of astronomy.

August 8–15, 2026 8 days from \$7,995

The journey begins with two nights in vibrant Bilbao, home to world-class architecture and a thriving culinary scene. Travelers enjoy a tasting of *pinxtos*, or Basque tapas, and have the opportunity to spend a day in the elegant coastal city of San Sebastián. They travel along the route of the Camino de Santiago, visiting important stops such as Burgos and León, and discovering links to astronomy along the legendary pilgrimage route. Eclipse day will find them at a stunning winery in the heart of Spain's León region—perfectly positioned within the path of totality. A private eclipse-watching event features wine tastings, vineyard tours, a panel discussion with astronomers, and a festive dinner.

The adventure concludes with two nights in Madrid, where specially curated activities include an astronomy-themed tour of the Prado Museum and a private visit to the Royal Observatory of Madrid, home to Spain's National Astronomical Observatory and Central Geophysical Observatory.

With a focus on history, astronomy, and Spanish flavors, this program combines the cultural delights of Madrid with the storybook landscapes of Old Castile. It kicks off in the heart of Madrid's museum

district, where highlights include a curated astronomy tour at the Prado Museum, a traditional tapas lunch, and a private, astronomer-led visit to the Royal Observatory of Madrid.

From their base in the lively city of Valladolid, travelers experience the historic region of Old Castile through the lens of astronomy. Along with a planetarium tour and a stargazing party, they explore two World Heritage sites: Segovia, known for its iconic Roman aqueduct, and the fortified medieval town of Àvila. On eclipse day, they head for the renowned Ribera del Duero wine region. Wine tastings, a panel discussion with astronomy experts, and a dinner with live music are on tap during eclipse-watching festivities at the 100-year-old Torremilanos wine estate—an unforgettable setting for the celestial event.
